Staff will provide youth with intrapersonal development and tools to build character, cultural competence, goals, life skills, and vision through workshops from qualified staff. Staff will also provide youth with case management and mentoring.

Selection of Mentors

All mentors are selected through an application and interview process. Mentors are finger printed and provided training before starting their service. MBK will be evaluated quarterly for improvement, research use, and effectiveness.

Selection of Students

All students will fill out an application, go through an interview process, and if invited will attend an orientation to start the program. Students are expected to stay in the program for the entire year. Parental / Guardian involvement will be necessary for each student's success.

In 2014, President Obama signed an initiative known as My Brother's Keeper to promote mentoring among young men of color.

On April 2015, we received a grant from San Joaquin County Probation Department to operate a community recidivism reduction program for youth. we received funding from Stockton Unified School District and later on San Joaquin County Probation Department and City of Stockton.

We are calling our program My Brother's Keeper.
